Ordering Dinners

Please remember to order your child's dinner every day. The office staff are currently filling in gaps on parent pay using their knowledge of the child and what they like to eat, however, this is not their responsibility. There will come a point where if you haven't ordered a lunch, there won't be one ordered and the office will call you to bring one to school for your child.

If you need any help with Parent Pay, please contact the office and they will go through it with you.

Absence from school

Please remember that our school doors close at 8.55am, if your child arrives after that time, they will be marked as late. If this is a regular occurrence, it could lead to an attendance panel meeting.

As we progress into the winter months, please remember that children can attend school with minor ailments such as a sore throat, headaches, runny noses or a slight temperature. The office will call if we feel that they are unable to be in school. Please see the below information to support your decisions.

It is really important that you call school to inform us if your children is going to be absent for the day.



Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

	Until...
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
