Absence from school

The office will call if we feel that they are unable to be in school. Please see the below information to support your decisions.

It is really important that you call school to inform us if your children is going to be absent or late for the day.

- Get all uniform and bags ready the night before
- Wash lunchboxes and get most of the lunch items ready, make sandwiches and put them in the fridge the night before
- Check the weather- be prepared to scrape the ice off your car!


